



This document outlines the schedule and services for the Bryant University Internship Program in London in partnership with EUSA for the Summer 2010.

Program participation

EUSA requirements

- Must have health and travel insurance.
- Must have *third-party liability* insurance coverage.
- Must be enrolled at Bryant University, or another U.S. institution, and receiving academic credit from Bryant.
- Must complete application form & essay
- Must have passport & Visa

Bryant University requirements:

- Must have completed a minimum of 75 credits
- Overall GPA of 2.5 or better
- Bryant students must meet with an Academic Advisor to complete EUSA application form
- Non Bryant students must contact Barbara Gregory

INTERNSHIP COMPONENT

Professional practice internship

EUSA makes appropriate internship placements based on the skills, interests and professional goals of the student and the project needs and work cycles of the internship sponsors. EUSA ensures that students are placed in internships that directly reflect or relate to their courses of study to ensure quality and academic relevance of the placement.

Monday – Thursday 6 hours a day

Previous internship placements: Universal Pictures, BBC Worldwide, Barclays Bank, Citigroup, Elizabeth Arden, Liz Claiborne, Dow Jones, Ernst & Young.

Cultural experience activities

Weekly historical and cultural tours will be offered and required for students to attend at least one per week.

ACADEMIC COMPONENT

Academic Class Component

A Bryant University professor will offer a three week course after the internship has been completed. Students will earn three academic credits for this class. Meetings regarding the class will be held during the spring in preparation for the class to be taken in London. The Professor and course will be announced by November 1.

SUPPORT SERVICES

Management and safety

EUSA's London office provides management and support to students for the duration of the program. A EUSA program director will be the principal contact for students on issues of housing, safety, culture and social life in the city. The program director will also serve as the principal contact with the Bryant University campus.

The program director will be available via regular office hours, outside the students' normal work schedules, to answer questions and resolve problems and will also be available to students 24 hours per day via cell phone for medical, legal or other emergencies.

Housing

All student residences are fully furnished and specially designed for the student lifestyle. Students will have access to a kitchen with modern cooking facilities, common areas, and high speed Internet.

Orientation

EUSA will provide a pre-departure orientation on the Bryant University campus and an on-site orientation for students upon arrival to London.

Social program

EUSA will provide a basic social program that will be available to students during the course of the program. This will include a tour of the city, museums and historical sites, as well as other optional excursions.
