This is also an ideal opportunity for companies to become involved with the University and work with bright, highly motivated Bryant students who are preparing to enter the workforce.

In this program, students work on real-world projects for individual client companies. As part of its goal to promote experiential learning for its students, Bryant's degree programs in International Business, Global Supply Chain Management and the MBA require students to complete a practicum. At the Chafee Center, students spend the semester on research and analysis to prepare and deliver high level, actionable reports to their client companies. This is accomplished by building on classroom learning, team work and guidance from a team of Bryant professors and business professionals.

The practica are conducted over the course of one term, approximately 10-12 weeks.

International Business (IB)

For companies with an international business project, the IB Practicum provides an ideal opportunity to work with some of the brightest and best young adults preparing to enter the workforce. The IB Practicum is offered in the Spring and Fall terms each year.

MBA Practicum

Bryant's full-time MBA program requires graduate students to participate in the MBA Practicum, offered annually May through August. An appropriate project scope and deliverables, whether domestic U.S., international, or combination, will be determined in discussions with the client company, Bryant faculty and staff, and the students.

Global Supply Chain Management (GSCM) Practicum

The GSCM Practicum provides companies with an opportunity to work with a talented team of senior students with the latest knowledge on supply chain issues, who can provide research, analysis and recommendations on real-world global supply chain issues.
